- Outdoor structure teacher suggested needs: seating/ picnic table secured to ground
- Affordability Fund Our school received \$9, 800 and we have \$4,400 left. Balance can carry over to next year (new rules). We've been using it for clothing, school supplies, hot lunch, field trips.
- Staff Appreciation Lunch: Date to be decided at next Staff Meeting
- June 28<sup>th</sup> grade 5 celebration. Teachers want to know if parents will decorate? Family is invited, formal. Theme ideas: Seascapes, Hollywood/Red Carpet, Decades(60's, 70's etc). (Costing: ask grade 5 committee to host fundraiser, catering will be at cost this year, small PAC budget to cover some of event costs) 26 grade 5's/ maybe 60-100 total attending.
- Question JH: Will there be kayaking this year? Mr Allen will be leading, more information to come.
- Beach day is June 27<sup>th</sup>
- Early Learning (Ready, Set, Learn) went well, PALS (Strong start + Kindy) focus on Math.
- June Kinder fair
- Grade 5 Elective forms to be sent home soon
- Green Team: Getting 10 x new planters (polyurethane) coming soon. We need to consider fencing to protect area.
- 1 or 2 portables (1 coming for sure) paving to be done to the area below
- Pre-school coming for sure 2024 for sure. Strong Start & Kidzone to go back into portable. Daycare is on the plans no proposed date yet.

# DRAFT BUDGET DISCUSSION

Open Idea Group Discussion: Look for sponsorships, cut any fundraisers under \$200, so many fundraiser dates with overtop of one another made it hard to keep track, timing could have been better planned, good variety, fundraisers all did less this year than previous years (hard year with inflation), flip give is super easy but very few people are using it (more info needs to be provided), limit to max 2 fundraisers a month (Sept/Jan) then 1 going forward

to close the year, focus on Cultus Lake Specific Outdoor Learning needs then fundraisers would be more impactful if people know what we are raising funds for, Questions AT - Sponsorships are there restrictions from the district? LW - Most like, she will investigate. Space in the yearbook advertisement?

FINAL DECISION: Reduce proposed Budget by 2/3's. Aim for 2023/4 year to raise between \$6,000-8,000. Also reduce spending to match, remove all small things like pizza for beach day, oranges on sports day and put that costs directly on parents. PAC will focus funds on more inclusive and enrichment style field trips, outdoors learning and schoolwide presentations etc instead of treats and food for event.
